Gold badge for Brian, our fundraising speaker

55 years following his rescue by Torbay lifeboat, Exmouth Lifeboat Fundraising Team volunteer Speaker, Brian Cole is set to receive an award for his dedication to the Institution. A Gold Badge will be presented to Brian at the national AGM at London's Barbican, on 21 May.

Within months of his accident, Brian began his volunteer career with the charity that saves lives at sea.

In June 1996, Brian married Beryl who rapidly shared his enthusiasm in fundraising for the charity that saves lives at sea. Beryl became Assistant Secretary and more recently, Secretary for the Exmouth Lifeboat Fundraising Team Committee. Together the couple visit community groups – Brian to speak about the work of the station's volunteers and Beryl to sell souvenirs. Beryl on her own merits has been awarded both a bronze and silver badge for her commitment to the charity. Brian says:

'I will feel most proud and honoured to accept this award on behalf of myself and all other volunteers representing Exmouth Lifeboat. I owe my life to the bravery and dedication of crew volunteers. For that reason, I decided to spend as much of my spare time fundraising on behalf of the Institution, as an expression of gratitude.'

In 2014, we were the third busiest RNLI station in Devon and the 15th busiest in the whole of the Institution. We launched 83 times on service, saving three lives and assisting 64 people – including four children.

Since we are a charity, we wouldn't be able to do all this without your donations and legacies. Our crew volunteers' continual competence based training, our high-performance kit and our state-or-the-art boathouse, lifeboats and launching systems are all funded by you, our supporters. This is the second year running that Antonio's have asked local school children to design a special flavour to help raise money for the lifesaving charity. This year the competition was open to Exeter Road Community Primary School and The Beacon Church of England Primary School pupils. The competition attracted around 120 entries, which cover the wall of the café.

'Katie's Strawberry Shortcake' was short-listed with four other entries and was chosen as the winner by owner, Tony Badcott. Tony explains;

'I chose Katie's flavour as it uses two classic flavours: strawberry and shortcake. It's a really simple, imaginative flavour which will ultimately raise a lot of money for Exmouth RNLI. Last year's winner, 'Darcy's Doughnut Delight' helped raise £350 and was consistently in our top five popular flavours throughout the year.'


Antonio's are kindly helping with printing costs of this edition of our newsletter.

2015 RNLI Lifeguard season dates are:

- main season 23rd May to 6th September
- peak season 4th July to 6th September

RNLI Lifeguards will also be delivering beach safety talks and Hit the Surf sessions to local school children on Exmouth beach this summer.



RNLI Lifeguard Supervisor, Julian Smart says;

'During the main season, we have three lifeguards with an ATV (quad bike) and rescue water craft (jet ski). During peak season there are four lifeguards plus both vehicles. There is a rescue tube for each guard and three rescue boards. Each lifeguard has their own personal first aid kit as well as the tower responder bag. Guards come from the local area with the local surf lifesaving clubs from Exmouth, Dawlish and Teignmouth providing a good percentage. During the first few months of the year, we have discovered that in a large proportion of shouts we were called to, casualties had neglected lifejackets to take to the water. Exmouth RNLI's Coastal Safety Officer, Peter Williams comments:

'We take seat belts in road vehicles for granted now - it's the law and for most of us wearing a seatbelt is now instinctive and it provides a measure of security and safety we probably don't plan on using when we set out on our journey.' Going afloat in whatever type of watercraft for pleasure is in a way the same. We don't plan on getting into difficulties afloat when we leave, however RNLI statistics based on launches and rescues in recent years show that over 50% of "shouts" are to assist private boat owners and water users. These might be yachts, motor boats, kayaks, canoes wind and kite surfers.

The RNLI is ready to launch anytime 24/7 in all weathers to assist both crew and vessels in difficulties.

'Problems are wide ranging - fuel and engine problems, deteriorating weather conditions, crew illness, fatigue or loss, component failure or breakage, disorientation/loss of position, sinking and overturning to name just a few.'

Whatever type of water sports you are planning, please consider the RNLI Top Tips:

- Wear a lifejacket/personal flotation device
- 2. Check on weather and tides.
- 3. Ensure your vessel is properly prepared fuel, resources, safety equipment, crew capability
- Carry a means of calling for help flares. VHF radio or Personal Locator Beacon PLB
- 5. Leave details ashore let others know where you are going and when you expect to be back.
- 6. Training knowledge of activity is essential

See www.completeguide.rnli.org.uk for more advice on keeping safe in the water and what to do in an emergency. RNLI Coastal Safety teams are available to offer free, impartial advice and guidance to assist boat owners in preparing and equipping their vessels and crew.
