Welcome to the spring edition of the Exmouth Lifeboat station newsletter, in this edition we are celebrating the achievements of our station. We are proud to announce two gold RNLI badges have been awarded to our fundraising volunteers.

### 50 years of Dedicated Service to the RNLI

Jean Carpenter has been recognised for 50 years of dedicated service to the RNLI. Jean, who now lives in Woodbury, began her fundraising for the RNLI in 1976 when she lived in southern Ireland. Jean began by collecting donations in envelopes, delivered through front doors, 'it was only a small village but everyone understood the important work the RNLI did, even in the poorer area they used to run after me down the street with their envelopes!'

On moving back to England Jean carried on her work fundraising for the RNLI and was awarded a silver badge in 2008.

Jean still runs the RNLI fundraising in Woodbury and opens her garden for the charity and sells plants, she still tirelessly raises money, Jean says, 'I'll carry on fundraising as long as I can, I do it so the lifeboat can get launched and lives can be saved at sea'.



### RNLI Gold Badge Recipient Has Lifesaving in his Bones

Michael Baldwin received the news he was to be awarded a Gold Badge from the RNLI for his 35 years of dedicated fundraising for the institution. Mike began his fundraising for the RNLI when he worked for the ambulance service in Lewisham, 'although there was no lifeboats in London on the Thames at the time, I understood the importance of the work the RNLI do, so I began fundraising for the Lewisham branch of the RNLI and was so surprised when I stood there with my collecting tin and people would ask what is a lifeboat?' Mike has also been a bone marrow donor for the Anthony Nolan Trust; in 1992 he was a successfully matched to a 14-yearold girl suffering from Leukemia in Italy. His bone marrow was flown from London by special air-courier to Rome.

Mike was awarded his silver badge in 1997, he moved to Exmouth 9 years ago and joined the Exmouth fundraising team and became a shop volunteer and is also active in fundraising events at the station and the wider community. Mike believes fundraising should be fun, and he has no desire to stop what he loves doing best.

Jean and Mike will be awarded their Gold Badges at an RNLI award ceremony on June 30 at Dartington Hall.

Volunteer crewmember David Preece will also be recognized at the Dartington award ceremony for his 20 years of dedicated service to the RNLI.

### Exmouth RNLI Fourth Busiest in Devon By Emma Tarling

Our statistics from last year reveal that we launched 57 times (12 Shannon and 45 D class) with nearly half (27) the services carried out in the dark. Our volunteer crew saved nine lives, assisted 49 people and spent 245 hours at sea. We were the fourth busiest lifeboat station in Devon.

The number of call-outs dropped significantly last year and this could be of a number of factors: Nationally, our charity's Respect the Water campaign gained huge publicity over the summer months and we continue to inform anyone near the coast of the unpredictability of water throughout the year.

We work closely with our lifeguard colleagues, both RNLI and Exmouth Beach Rescue volunteers during the summer that reduces the need to launch lifeboats to watersports casualties.

Together with the continuous work of our Education and Coastal Safety volunteers, we're all working towards reducing the number of preventable loss of lives at sea, as a Community Lifesaving team.

# Exmouth lifeboat station set to recruit visitor guides By Emma Tarling

Lifeboat Visits Officer, Derek Cairns is asking for members of the community who would like to become station visitor guides at Exmouth Lifeboat station. Derek says: 'We have a high demand for visits to look at our Shannon class lifeboat *R* and *J* Welburn, its launch and recovery system and D class inshore lifeboat *George Bearman*. ### RNLI Teamwork and Training Saved Lives on a Stormy Day



Roger Jackson was awarded a Bronze Medal for Gallantry from the RNLI in 2012 for the life saving actions of himself and the crew onboard Exmouth's D Class George Bearman.

The shout came through on Sunday 23 October 2011 to rescue four people from a capsized RIB in the river Exe, Roger was the helm, and his crew was Andy Williams and Mark Champion. The lifeboat launched in gale force 7, the crew located the upturned vessel and Roger steered towards them and held the boat steady whilst one by one the four swam from their upturned vessel and were helped aboard by Andy and Mark. With the four safely onboard the crew headed back to the station where conditions were too unsafe for a trolley recovery, Roger beached the boat high on the beach so the paramedics could attend to the survivors.

The crew carried out the rescue and beach landing in 24 minutes.

Roger says, 'we worked as a team and got a good result. Without the right equipment and training programs in place, it could so easily have been a different outcome. The honour I received is for the station and the crew.'

Andy and Mark were awarded Vellums for their role in the rescue of the four. Roger is now one of the deputy coxswains at Exmouth, Mark is a helm and navigator, both work their day jobs and are volunteer crew and Andy is now the full time station mechanic.

## Exmouth RNLI volunteers assist four from two stricken yachts By Emma Tarling

Inshore lifeboat *George Bearman* was tasked at 12.35pm on 28 February following reports of two yachts aground in the Exe estuary.

At 12:42pm *George Bearman* reached the first casualty vessel, a 27-foot lifting keel sailboat with two people on board, just off Cockwood. Once on scene, it was apparent that the vessel had beached too hard in the sand bank to attempt a tow, so crew volunteers advised the casualties they would return after checking on the second stricken vessel.

A 39-foot deep-keeled ketch was soon located upriver, also high and dry. The two experienced local sailors had already streamed anchors to prevent their yacht blowing further onto a mud bank in the force two/three winds. Advice was given and it was estimated the casualties should be able to float between 7pm and 7.30pm.

On returning to the first casualty vessel, volunteers streamed one anchor to hold the boat when it refloated. A commercial operator was also tasked to assist the owner recover their yacht that had grounded due to mechanical failure, estimating the flood tide would lift the vessel at 6.15pm. The local couple were taken ashore to Exmouth by the crew volunteers to warm up.

Helmsman David Preece commented: 'All four of the casualties had lifejackets and were fully equipped for their journeys, but bad luck and propulsion difficulties halted their sailing for several hours.'
