Exmouth's Southern Co-Op raises £1,000 for the local RNLI



The staff at Exmouth's Southern Co-Op in Brixington have raised an incredible £1,000 for Exmouth RNLI in their 2018/19 year long fundraiser for the local lifesaving charity.

The campaign, organised by Store Manager, Kirsten Wade and her staff, involved raising funds from collecting pots at the store check-outs; a fundraising stall manned by 2018 Mayor, Brian Cole and his wife Beryl, and a raffle where prizes were donated by several local businesses who supported their efforts.

Kirsten said, "Our staff run an annual fundraiser to benefit the local community and last year they voted for the proceeds to support Exmouth RNII

I'm very grateful to my staff for their support throughout the year, to ex-Mayor Brian Cole and his wife and the many local businesses who contributed to the campaign that included Andrew Humphries Jewellers, Lympstone Manor, Skin and Tonic, Headlines Hair Dressers, Chadni Express Indian Take Away and Lets Fry Away Chip Shop, as well as my own company for donating a Southern Co-Op Hamper."

Both Exmouth lifeboats launch on service as boat jumble sale starts

On the morning of 7 April, Solent Coast-guard tasked both lifeboats to search for a missing person in the river Exe, near Imperial Recreation ground. Inshore D class lifeboat George Bearman II launched at 9.17am and Shannon class lifeboat R and J Welburn launched at 9.26am.

Crew volunteers, members of the public and the Community Safety team were busy setting up stalls; the Fundraising Events team were making bacon baps and hot drinks to raise money to help save lives at sea, when the call for assistance came through. 19 stall holders had given a donation of £10 each to sell their boat and watersport jumble, filling both boat halls and lined the esplanade along the seafront. Devon and Somerset Fire Service attended with their engine, Exmouth Coastguard had also been tasked to search, so could not attend.



The three-hour event raised £1,673.10 and was organised by the Fundraising Events team. Deputy Coxswain, Roger Jackson spent over two weeks arranging collections in the community, following the appeal for jumble. Of the total, £851.25 was raised by selling generous donations

The Community Safety Team checked 10 lifejackets, condemning three unfit for purpose. Shop volunteers were busy, taking £477.45 – the highest daily figure this year. The last time a boat jumble sale was held five years ago, £1,006 was raised.

Roger Jackson praised the volunteers: 'What a great event! We haven't had this event for five years and it's so touching of the generosity of people. We had some wonderful donations and I would like to thank everybody who kindly donated jumble to us, as well as supporting the day. A massive thank you to all involved.'

Both lifeboats were stood down, together with Teignmouth RNLI, Coastguard Rescue Teams from Exmouth, Teignmouth and Beer, Police and Coastguard helicopters at around midday, but no casualty was found.

Des goes the distance for Exmouth RNLI

Veteran long distance runner and Exmouth RNLI volunteer, Des White will be running this year's London Marathon in aid of the local charity.

Des has recently qualified as a Tour Guide at the station and is looking forward to raising funds for Exmouth RNLI by running what will be his 43rd marathon. He said 'I enjoy my work as a volunteer Guide at the lifeboat station, I'm a member of Exmouth Harriers and, as well as volunteering there, I run past it most days on training runs and to raise funds for it seemed the perfect choice'.



Amongst his incredible successful 42 marathon achievements, Des, whose first marathon was in 1980 and who will be 65 in February, has successfully run 17 London Marathons, 3 in New York and was the winner of the New Forest race in 1986. His best time is 2 hours 26 minutes set in the 1987 London Marathon and he aims to complete this year's event in the top 10 of the 65-69 age group. Deputy Chair of the Exmouth RNLI Fundraising Committee, Robin Humphreys, said ""Des is one of the volunteer Tour Guides at the Exmouth RNLI Lifeboat Station. He has run 42 marathons to date and is competing in the London Marathon on 28 April, where he will be hoping for good running weather and aims to complete it in 3hrs 20mins. Des will be fundraising for the RNLI and any donations will be gratefully received. We all thank him for his support and wish him the very best of luck."

Exmouth RNLI Stats 2018

Last year, we were the sixth busiest RNLI lifeboat station in the South West with 73 launches. We assisted 53 people and saved 3 lives.

Exmouth Lifeboat Fundraising team raised £73,327.19 which included £10,000 from the Fish & Chip ball, organised by the Events team.

Volunteer tour guides showed a whopping 5,812 visitors around our station!

Our shop took an amazing £95,071 and was the 12th busiest in the RNLI and third in the Channel region.



They also raised £1,349 from selling second-hand books, donated by the public. Thank you to everybody - supporters and volunteers, who donated money, time and skills to help us save lives at sea.
